



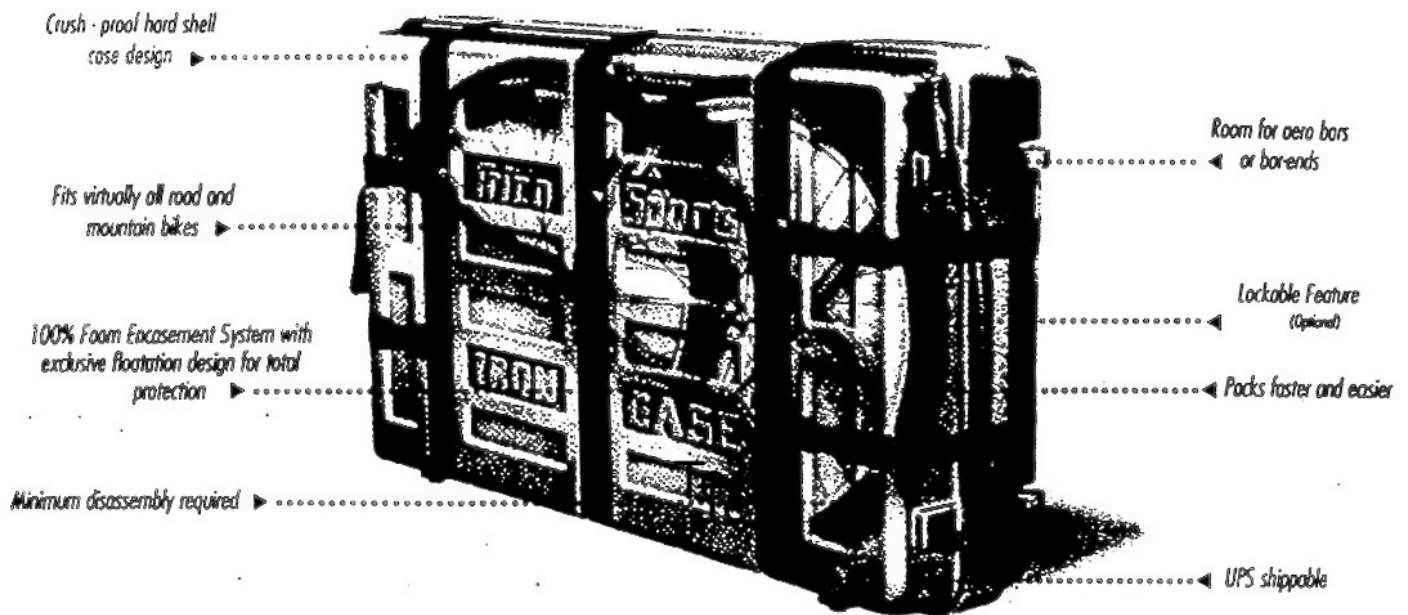
Packing Tips

To compliment the enclosed instructions with your Trico Sports Iron Case:

1. Do a test pack! This is extremely important to familiarise yourself with disassembly and allow ample time to pack before departure. There are some good videos of how to pack the box on YouTube.
2. It's always a good idea to wrap a towel, bubblewrap or pipe foam around the more sensitive areas of your bike (ie. derailleur, handlebars and frame) to prevent nicks and scratches from components rubbing together during transport.
3. Make sure all components and tools are positioned securely.
4. Pay attention when placing the lid over the bottom. For ease of closure and to avoid damage, ensure that the riveted wire mechanism for locking at each end of the lid rests **outside** the bottom before compressing the lid over the bottom.
5. If using locks to secure the bike box please use TSA LOCKS.
6. We recommend that when travelling that you arrive earlier than normal to allow time for your bike to be checked in. Please don't forget travel insurance.
7. Always check the bike box upon arrival at your destination. Should you notice any damage to the case and/or bike and suspect it was the fault of the airline, report it immediately to an airline official before leaving the airport and let us know (please see our Terms and Conditions).
8. Finally, enjoy your trip!

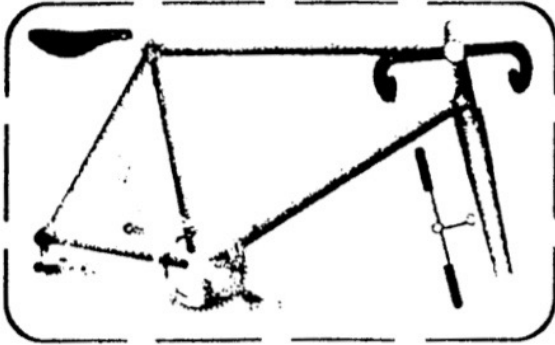

Instructions

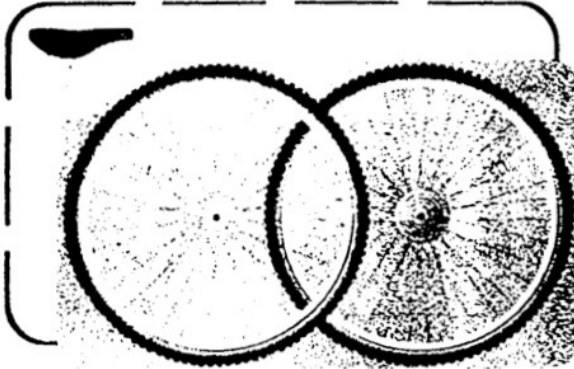
1 Set-Up:

- Unbuckle and separate two halves of Ironcase bicycle carrier (capacity: one complete mountain, touring, or road bicycle including aerobars).
- Lay the carrier flat on floor in its open position-Position three belly straps away from carrier.
- Place one regular foam piece inside shell half making sure foam and case are properly aligned.



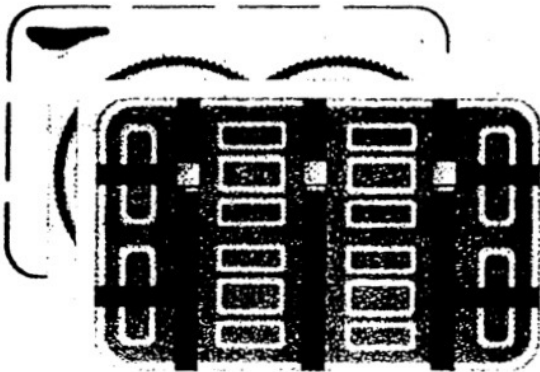
2 Preparation:

- Remove both front and rear wheels from your bicycle
- Install the front and rear fork spreaders (very important).
- Remove skewers from wheel hubs (optional). Remove pedals.
- Depending on frame style either 1.) Loosen and turn your handlebars until they rest against the top tube for road bike frames, or 2.) Remove and place the handlebars inside the case parallel to the forks for mountain bike frames-wrap bars with towel to prevent scratching (cable removal is not required).
- Depending on frame size either lower or remove your seat. (You may want to mark your position on the post with a piece of tape).
- Line up the right crank arm (chain side) with the chain stay tube. Take up the slack in the chain with a bungee cord or nylon string provided-make sure rear derailleur is as close to chain stay tube as possible to prevent damage.



3 Placement:

- Lay bike on non-drive side in bottom half of case, front of bike towards handle.
- Place second regular foam piece over frame.
- Lay wheels on top of foam, rear wheel first (free wheel up, then overlap front wheel).
- Place third foam sheet over wheels, (make final check so no bicycle parts or wheels are touching sides of case).



4 Closing:

- Close case by placing top shell over bottom half of carrier-make sure both halves fit easily together.
- Fasten and cinch the three strap buckles-adjust for proper snug tightness-make sure all extra accessories (clothing, tools, etc.) are properly wrapped and secured to prevent scratching or denting of bike part.
